





Remarks on a new cooperation in the Alpine Space

There is a demand on stronger cooperation in spatial planning in the Alpine Space

but

There is no lack of institutions and cross-border cooperation in the Alpine Space

therefore

- 1. A new cooperation will clearly have to define its objectives and benefits to avoid double work
- 2. A network within the trans sectoral field of spatial planning will have to look for close cooperation with the (main) existing initiatives

Bavarian initiative on "saving space"

A new benchmark for settlement and traffic is to be set in the Bavarian state planning act:

- max. 5 hectare/day until 2030
 = reduction at 50%
- a bundle of measures of all sectors has to contribute to this objective







Remarks on open spaces in the Alpine region

- Preservation and creation of (connected) open spaces and avoiding urban sprawl are of common interest in most Alpine regions
- The instruments and levels of spatial planning are different and therefore a challenge and task for transnational cooperation - a best practice exchange will be welcome
